#### **Dressing for Winter**

As you know, during the winter/spring months in Santa Barbara, we can experience a whole spectrum of weather within one day. Because of this, we ask that you <u>dress your child in layers</u> each day. You are also welcome to leave jackets and long sleeve shirts in their cubby box for their teacher to access when needed. To help ensure that you get all the clothing back, please label your child's clothes. Thanks!

#### **Sickness Policy**

Common colds and flus that we normally see this time of year are out in full force, alongside viruses such as COVID-19 and RSV. While we realize it can be incredibly frustrating, we are mandated by Community Care Licensing to send children home with symptoms such as runny noses, coughs, and fevers. If your child becomes sick or is sent home from school, there are a couple of ways they can return, depending on the symptoms and diagnosis. If your child has a fever, they can return after being fever-free for 24hrs without medicine. With stomach symptoms, your child can return after 24 hours without loose bowel movements or vomiting. If your child does have symptoms that could be COVID-19 (or allergies, a cold, or other respiratory illness), your child can return with a Dr.'s note, a negative COVID test, or after 5 days at home and their symptoms are resolving. Even if your child does not have COVID but only has a cold or other respiratory illness, please be respectful of the other children in the class and keep your child home until their symptoms are resolving, so they do not spread the illness to others.

Please be in communication with us regarding your child's illness, so we can best track the illnesses going around and keep all of our students as safe and healthy as possible. Thank you!

## DEVOTIONAL

January is often a time of making resolutions and hoping for new beginnings, but we also hear that so many resolutions only last a few weeks. Perhaps more important than big resolutions are the small decisions and habits we form in our day-to-day activities.

We get up in the morning, make breakfast, get children dressed, make lunches, and hopefully get everyone out the door on time. We go through the mundane tasks one by one, often repeating the same activities every day, if not several times per day.

What small decisions can we make each day that form us and our families in significant ways over time? How would our lives look different if we dedicated 5 minutes every day to make sure our families know they are loved? Something as simple as seeing the alarm 5 minutes earlier and taking the time to tell our children, "Good morning! I love you!" as they sit down for breakfast or are gotten out of bed or as brief as a 5 minute check in at dinner if what was good and bad about each person's day can strengthen those relationships over the days and weeks. They can help each person know they are loved and cared for.

What would your life look like in December if you made a small change this January instead of a huge resolution? How would these small habits form your character and shape your family and relationships? These January days of small activities are important. They are important for the ways they physically and emotionally help our children grown and develop, and for the ways they transform our lives. As you go about the small activities of life this January, may you see the way small actions make a difference.
