The September theme is **LOVE**

September 6th: 1 John 4:16; Who is Jesus?
September 13th: John 3:16, Luke 15:3-7; The Sheep that Was Lost
September 20th: Matt 22:37-39; The Greatest Commandment
September 27th: Luke 10:33; Jesus tells about the Good Samaritan

Do you have any books that you go back to over and over again? Books that have encouraged you? Or shaped you profoundly? Or remind you of life's simple lessons that you seem to forget all too easily? I am fairly predictable in that when I am feeling distant from God or my faith I go back to reading the Gospels. Do you have any books that you return to again and again? Or any stories in Scripture that are your anchors?

I was grieving a lot of things last week, when I felt the Holy Spirit nudging me to return to the Gospel of Mark and hear about the beginning of Jesus's ministry. As I sunk into the familiar beginning of Mark's gospel I was reminded of Jesus' remarkable baptism at the hands of John the Baptist: "At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove." And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased" (Mark 1:9-11). And then I read how even after Jesus was tempted by the devil he started to boldly declare the Good News: "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!" (Mark 1:15) After this I read about the calling of the first disciples and how with no questioning or hesitation they started to follow Jesus.

By returning to the familiar words of Mark's gospel, in quick succession, I was reminded that Jesus' whole ministry is radically different from anything else that this world offers. Christianity is about the Heavenly Father who loves His son Jesus. Christianity is about Good News of life and salvation finally coming to earth and that Good News being announced through God's beloved son. And Christianity is about people in the ancient world and people today who follow Jesus immediately and without question because they know in the depth of their being that He holds the words of life. Even if there is so much to grieve in life, it doesn't change the radical good news that the Gospel offers the whole world, and that all of us young or old can find salvation in; we find salvation in the beloved son Jesus that the Father has sent to save us. Glory be to God.
